Their object is plunder and after they have accomplished their Business in Virginia, it is more than probable they will visit us, every Preparative ought therefore to be immediately made to put the State in a proper Posture of Defence, and to prevent the military Stores and Provision from falling into their Hands; for the Attainment of which Ends we desire you to order the Whole Militia of your County to put themselves in Readiness to march at a minutes Warning to such Place as they shall be commanded.
