We beg Leave to refer your Excellency to our Letter of Yesterday p. 92 giving a short Account of the Transports and Troops from the Head of Elk being safe in this Harbour. We shall adopt such Measures to guard and subsist the Convention Troops and British Prisoners captured in the Action of the Cowpens, on their March through this State as may be necessary and consonant to a Resolution of Congress of the 3<sup>d</sup> Instant and such as the Means in our power may afford. We have wrote to the President of the State of Pensylvania fully on the Subject of the March of there Troops. Matters remain in the same State as Yesterday respecting the British Ships and Forces here we are extraordinary anxious to hear from the Marquis and the Situation of the Southern Army.

Two armed Schooners supposed to be British passed the Ships Liber lying off this Harbour yesterday, and proceeded up the Bay immediately, we do not know what there Intentions are but suppose them to be on a plundering Expedition.

Yesterday two armed Schooners passed by the Ships off this Harbour and proceeded immediately up the Bay, they are supposed to be British what their Intentions are we do not know but presume they are on a plundering Expedition. As there are large Quantities of Stores at the Head of Elk, it may be an Object with them to destroy or take them, and therefore we request you in Case there p. 93 should not be any regular Troops at the Head of Elk to order out one hundred Militia to be commanded by a Capt Lieutenant and Ensign to be stationed there to protect the Stores until further Orders from this Board or until you hear of the Enemy going down the Bay.
