a Guard of the Town Militia as he may judge necessary and to agree April 6 on and establish proper Signals for warning and assembling the Liber No. 78 County Militia on the Approach of the Enemy. The Ships left us last Night and had proceeded down as low as poplar Island when p. 112 our Look out Boat returned.

We have seen your Proposals relative to the Shads. We agree to your Terms and expect that you will take particular Care that the Fish are well cured in every way necessary; and that the Quantity in each Barrel be marked and your Account delivered in on the Oath either of yourself or the Person who packs the Fish, we think it will be best to have one third pickled and two thirds smoaked. We agree to take sixty thousand or a greater Quantity if you can supply us with them, for the Salt necessary apply to Mr Henry Rozier who will on our Order deliver it. If you are disappointed there, borrow it for the States Account and it shall be repaid.
