Adams for the British Prisoners confined in the public Goal, and have them marched immediately to Frederick Town under a Guard to consist of one commanding Officer one Serjeant one Corporal and twenty rank and File there to be delivered to Col^o Philip Thomas Lieutenant of Frederick County, to be by him forwarded to Fort Frederick and put under the Care of Col^o Moses Rawlings Commander of the Fort. We hereby empower and direct you to impress as many Horses as may be necessary to mount the Guard ordered on this Service, You will order that particular Attention is paid to Matthew Mangan late Captain of the Jack o Lanthon, he is represented to this Board as a Man that has been principally concerned in burning the Houses of the Inhabitants of this State.

You will be so obliging as to have delivered to Cap^t Nicholas Maccubbin or his Order all the British Prisoners now under Guard in this City.

The three British Prisoners with Taylor were yesterday delivered by John Wood, and were immediately ordered into Confinement. We have not yet determined what to do with Taylor as soon as we do, you shall have Information. His Excellency being out of Town prevents our sending the Commissions you request on his return you may depend upon having them immediately sent.
