The official Assistant of the superintendant of the Finances of the
 united States has required of us two thousand Barrels of good sweet
 Flour, such as will pass Inspection as merchantable to be delivered on
 or before the 24th Currant on some of the navigable waters of
 chesepcak to Matthew Ridley Esq^r we are convinced that the requi-
 sition should be complied with, and every Effort ought to be made to
 procure and deliver it within the Time. We wish to have the whole
 delivered at Baltimore Town, but are apprehensive it will not be in
 your power, you will therefore [send] as much there you possibly can
 and the remainder at George Town unless upon Consultation with M^r
 Ridley, you should think it would answer the Purpose at any other
 Post and save Expencc, then we would have you deliver it at such
 Post, you will have the whole inspected and turned over to M^r Ridley,
 giving him Notice of the Time and Places of Deposit that he may be
 present. You will inform us immediately what Prospects you have of
 complying with this requisition and in what Time. We shall be glad
 to know what Quantities of Flour has been turned over by you to the
 Continent.
