It appears by an Order of the 23<sup>rd</sup> of May last drawn on the Treasurer of the western shore in favor of Col<sup>o</sup> Samuel Smith for the use of his Battalion of Militia for two thousand six hundred and nineteen pounds twelve shillings and six Pence that there still remains due to the said Col<sup>o</sup> Samuel Smith and his Battalion, one thousand one hundred and ninety eight pounds, three shillings and eleven pence Specie to be paid to him or his Assigns for the use of the said Battalion according to the Act of Assembly entitled "An Act relating to Public Creditors."
