Your Letter of the 9<sup>th</sup> respecting the Ordinance we have been honored with and have given Orders accordingly to have them immediately put in Readiness to comply with the Requisition of His Excellency the Commander in Chief. There are only four at this Post, including those left by Col<sup>o</sup> Stephens, which can be put in any tolerable Condition, the remaining six must be had from Baltimore and we have wrote to Capt<sup>n</sup> Keeports to deliver that Number to your Order, and have directed him to select the best Carriages which we apprehend may be repaired with more Facility and Expedition at Camp than in Baltimore: however should you think otherwise, M<sup>r</sup> Keeports has our Instructions to have them compleated with all possible Expedition. A Vessel should be procured by M<sup>r</sup> Poe to carry the Guns to York and he may call at this Port for the 4 here. Capt<sup>n</sup> Buchanan was furnished with an Officer and Guard and dispatched, soon after his Arrival here yesterday
