That the said Treasurer pay to Joseph Brewer fourteen pounds eighteen shillings & ten pence of the same Emission of the money aforesaid due him per Account passed by the Dep^y Aud.

p. 153 Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Zephaniah Turner Esq^r Twenty five pounds of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit &^{ca} of the money appropriated for the Defence of the State on Account.

That the said Treasurer pay to Thomas Johnson jun^r three thousand, five hundred pounds of the same Emission of the money appropriated for the present Campaign to be forwarded as follows, one thousand five hundred pounds to Thomas Richardson Esq^r Commissary of Montgomery County one thousand pounds to Col^o Thomas Price Commissary of Frederick County and one thousand pounds to Col^o Moses Rawlings Commissary of Washington County on Account.

Permission given to Col^o Uriah Forrest to Load two Vessels with Flesh Provisions &^{ca} for the French Fleet in Chesepeake Bay.
