p. 174 Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Capt. Robert Denny eight pounds ten shillings Specie part of the 4000£ appropriated to the Officers going to the Southward on Account.

p. 175 Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Capt. Robert Denny five pounds of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit &^{ca} of the money appropriated for the present Campaign to be delivered over to Thomas Barclay a soldier in the Maryland Line lately returned from Captivity in Charles Town So. Carolina on Account.

That M^r Shaw, Armourer deliver to Lieut. Henry Clements sixteen muskets and Accoutrements, sixteen Cartridge Boxes and four rounds Cartridges to each.

That the Commissary of Stores deliver to Philip Windsor a soldier of the Delaware Regiment one Shirt, one pair woollen overalls one pair Socks and one pair Shoes.

Permission is hereby given George Lumbly of Baltimore County to solicit the Officer Commanding the Out Posts of the American Army for his Licence to go into the City of New York for the purpose of obtaining a Passage from thence to Great Britain not to return to this Stae during the present War between America and Great Britain without the leave of the Governor and Council for the time being first had and obtained.

[Council to Charles Blake, Esqr.]

Your Letters of the 23rd & 28th Ult^o we have received and presume Col^o Blaine has given you Directions about the Cattle collected in your County for the Army as he informed us in Sept^r the Places of Deposit on your Shore were approved of by his Excellency and that Measures had been or would be immediately taken for slaughtering the Cattle and salting them down in Bulk and transporting the Beef to the Army. The Time of year, and situation you describe the Cattle to be in, render it necessary you should immediately proceed to slaughtering the whole and salting them down, if you have a Sufficient Quantity of Salt on Hand, if you have not you should make immediate Application to Col^o Blaine for what you may want, at any Rate, as many Cattle should be slaughtered immediately as you have Salt to preserve. When you have a considerable Quantity ready to be sent off, inform us, and we will send you Vessels, if they can be obtained
