We informed you some Time ago, that it would be unnecessary to collect any more, under our former Orders. It will be proper for you to make Preparations to receive and secure the Pork you expect, we will furnish the Money for the Purpose, as soon as we are able. If Money of the last Emission will answer you may have that as soon as you please. As you best know what Quantity of Meat to expect, you will be the best Judge of what Quantity of salt you ought to procure.
