This Board is of Opinion that the following Pay be allowed to the Officers of the Barges. Captain, fifteen Pounds per month first and second Lieutenants, Ten Pounds p month, and one ration of Salt, and fresh Provision not exceeding one ration each per Day, but to receive no Pay for back rations.
