We have yours of the 16th. We approve of your Conduct in paroling the Officers and confining the Privates in Prison. Capt. Walters is going to New York to endeavour to effect an Exchange for the Whole, except Smallwood and the Blacks; mean Time, if a Guard should be necessary, you will apply to Col^o Sam¹ Smith, who will furnish a Militia Guard. You will also continue to supply them with Provisions, 'til the Intendant has it done by Contract, and you shall be reimbursed your Expences. Smallwood must be kept in Irons, 'til our farther Directions, and the Blacks must be kept for their Owners.
