It appears by the Petition of John Norfolk jun^r and the Letter of Samuel Chew, James Heighe and Edward Johnson Esq^{rs} Justices of Calvert County, that the said John Norfolk was presented for an Assault and Battery committed on a certain Dilah Taylor, and was fined by the Court of said County £35. State Money, and that at the Time of imposing the same Fine, the said Sum of Money was only equal to £7. Specie. It also appears that the said John Norfolk jun^r made full Satisfaction to the said Dilah Taylor for the Injury done him. We do therefore remit all the said Fine except £7. Specie and do direct you, on Payment of that Sum and Costs, to discharge the said John Norfolk jun^r from the Execution for the same Fine.
