Capt. Golder returns to Baltimore, to procure Quarters for such of your Officers as are not already provided for. In executing this Business we have directed him to take your Orders, as to the Room necessary for each Officer. We should be very happy if the Situation of the Town would permit every Gentleman to be quartered in the most agreeable and the most commodious Manner, but as some of the Inhabitants complain of being subjected to great Inconveniencies, in Consequence of their Houses being occupied, we doubt not the Officers would rather submit to be a little straintened in their Accommodations, than give any just Cause of Uneasiness. We are informed that one Officer has an entire House with five Rooms, to himself, and that another large House is occupied by three Officers, a Captⁿ and two Subalterns.
