p. 337 That the said Treasurer pay to Capt John Middleton of Col^o Lees Legion eleven Pounds, five shillings specie out of the money arising from the five shillings specie Tax, for the purpose of providing Forage &^{ca} for the Horses procured under the Act to furnish twenty Dragoon Horses for the Southern Army on Account of the Continent.

That the said Treasurer pay to Capt Zedekiah Walley eight hundred and ninety eight Pounds, six shillings and also four hundred and fifteen Pounds, nine shillings specie out of the money appropriated for the Barges, to be paid over to the Officers and Men of the Barges under his command due them on Accounts passed.—

That the said Treasurer pay to Capt Levin Spedding three Pounds specie out of the money aforesaid due on Account passed.—

That the said Treasurer pay to Capt Daniel Bryan seventy three Pounds, fourteen shillings specie out of the money aforesaid due him and men on Account passed.—

That the said Treasurer pay to Edward Pearson four Pounds eleven shillings and six Pence specie agreeable to the "Act to adjust the Debts due from this State" on Account passed.—

Captain Walley representing to the Board that a Vessel to carry Stores &^{ca} for the Barges, is absolutely necessary for his cruize. Agreed that Captain Speddens Schooner be employed at twenty five Pounds per Month to commence from the time she enters into the service and that the State insure her while in that service, the Vessel first to be valued on Oath by two Persons acquainted with the real Value of such Vessels.—

Although by the Act of the last Session upon which our Instructions were founded, no Manor or reserved Lands can be affected by a Common or Special Warrant, or Warrant of Resurvey; yet the Surveyor is not restrained from running the Lines of any Tract of Land into Manors or reserved Lands pursuant to a Warrant of Resurvey obtained for the Purpose of satisfying the Chancellor that
p. 378 that Land which may now appear to be Vacancy, owing to the Variation of the Compass, was included within the original Grant upon which the Warrant of Resurvey issued. We therefore direct you to run into any Manors or reserved Lands, where it is necessary for the above Purpose.
