We have received Information that the Enemy's Privateers have again appeared in our Bay, and are as high up as Patuxent, where they have driven a Vessel on Shore, their Force is inconsiderable. You are requested to return immediately to this Place, and give Orders for the Barges absent to repair here without Delay; our Wish and Expectations are, that your Fleet sail some Time Tomorrow. You will not omit to bring a sufficient Quantity of Provisions for your Cruize, from Baltimore. The Intendant has drawn an Order on M^r M^cLaughlin for 100 Blankets, which you will receive and bring down with you, for the Use of the Barges.
