You must not part with the red Money but as Specie, and if you cannot procure Barrels and Salt with the Money, we would have you dispose of as much Wheat or Flour as will furnish Barrels and Salt for the Pork you may receive for Taxes. You had better dispose of the Cattle you received of M^r Jenifer.
