We have been honored with your Letter by Capt. LeBrun, and we should be very happy was it in our Power, to grant the Permission you request, in the fullest Latitude: but the same Objections which operated formerly, still exist, the Officers of Maryland being yet employed in every County of the State, in recruiting Men to fill up the Maryland Line: and your being permitted to recruit under these Circumstances, would only serve to enhance the Bounty given to the Men, without adding to the Number recruited. We have no Kind of Objection to your enlisting the German Prisoners in the State; and if you deemed our Permission necessary for that Purpose, you will be pleased to consider this Letter as such.
