[Council to The Chevalier Villebrune]

We are informed by Col<sup>o</sup> Howard that Alexander M<sup>o</sup>Auly and John Likely, Subjects of his Britannic Majesty, came to Baltimore from New York in a Return Flag, sent by you with Prisoners and that he permitted them to land and come to Annapolis to make Application for our Passport to Virginia. The Subjects of the King of Great Britain cannot come into our State without our Permission first obtained, and this not having been done, we should consider them as Prisoners of War, had they not come in a Flag under your Direction. We request you would have them returned, and in the mean Time, every Precaution used to prevent their having any intercourse with the Inhabitants of the State and that you would give Orders to the Commanders of your Flags returning to the State, not to receive any of the Subjects of his Britannic Majesty, on Board, without our Leave first given.
