In Answer to your Letter of the 15th Sept^r requesting our Advice, as to what Certificates are to be received in Payment for the Manors sold for the Redemption of the Certificates of the Maryland Troops; we are of Opinion that all Certificates in the Possession of the Persons to whom granted, and those granted to discharged Soldiers and the Representatives of deceased Soldiers, and all Certificates transferred and attested by the Officer commanding the Regiment to which the Assignor belongs, or the Officer commanding Troops at particular Posts or Stations, ought to be taken. Many Cases may come under your Cognizance which may not at present occur to us, so that we cannot give our Opinion and Advice until the particular Case is defined; should you hereafter meet with any other Difficulty and refer it to us, we will express our Opinion with Chearfulness.
