Commission of Letters of Marque and Reprisal issued to William Thomas Commander of the Schooner Freemason one hundred and four Tons burthen, navigated with twenty one men, mounting six Carriage Guns, belonging to Charles Crookshanks and Company of Maryland dated the 25th of October 1782.—

Samuel Chase Esquire a Member of the House of Delegates waits on the Council with an Order of the House, signifying the Opinion of the General Assembly, that the Election of the Governor be notified to the Citizens of this State by Proclamation issued to the Sheriffs of the several Counties, to be by them Published; by the Sheriff of Ann Arundel on this Day and by the Sheriffs of the other Counties on the 14th Day of next Month—The Council thereupon direct the Sheriffs to make Proclamation accordingly.—

His Excellency William Paca Esquire having this Day been Qualified in the Senate House in the Presence of the Members of the General Assembly, took his Seat in the Council.—
