Your Excellency's Candor will impute this Requisition to the calamitous Situation of our fellow Citizens whose numerous Farms and Plantations adjacent to the Water are now exposed to the Depredations of the Enemy's Barges.—

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to George Hawn nine pounds, sixteen shillings and eight pence—George Onstreet nine pounds fifteen shillings and Peter Chaille one hundred and ninety pounds, nine shillings and nine pence and fifteen pounds, eighteen shillings and four pence specie agreeable to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State per Accounts passed.—

That the said Treasurer pay to Lieut's Samuel Hanson & David Luckett each, twenty five pounds, nine shillings and nine pence specie out of the money that came from the Havana put into the Treasury by Major General Smallwood to be by them Accounted for.—

That the said Treasurer pay to Thomas Johnson Jun<sup>r</sup> fifty pounds specie out of the money app<sup>d</sup> for the Barges to be applied in making advances to the Officers & Crew of the Barges on Account.—
