Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Philip Ford four pounds, ten shillings—Richard Ridgely, Daniel Bowly and William West Executors of Thomas Harrison Deceased, eight hundred and thirty seven pounds four shillings and eight pence—David Drew nineteen pounds, thirteen shillings and nine pence—& Capt William D. Beall twenty five pounds specie agreeable to the "Act to adjust the Debts due from this State" per Certificates and Accounts adjusted and passed.

That the said Treasurer pay to Richard Ridgely one hundred and sixteen pounds, fifteen shillings and two pence specie the Principal and Interest of a Certificate issued to Thomas Harrison agreeable to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State for money lent in May 1780.—
