We are well informed that you have undertaken to prolong the Time for which Furloughs have been granted by the Officers to the Soldiers of the United States. A little Reflection will convince you that this is an unwarrantable Assumption of Power, and must be attended with Consequences very detrimental to the States and injurious to the Soldiers, and we therefore admonish you not to exercise this Power in Future. The Soldiers whose Furloughs you have, illegally, renewed, have, by regarding your assumed Power, in not returning at the Time stipulated by the Officers, subjected themselves to capital Punishment for Desertion, and we consider it your indispensable Duty to inform them immediately, that you had no Authority to extend the Time of their Furloughs, and that they should, without Delay, return to the Place mentioned by their Officer
