 p. 408 The Act of Congress, of March the 15<sup>th</sup>, 1779, considers the Officers and Soldiers of those Corps which compose no Part of the eighty eight Battalions originally apportioned on the States, as belonging to the Quotas of those States of which they were Citizens.
- p. 409 The Laws of the State direct the Commissioner for settling Depreciation, to settle with all Officers and Soldiers, who are considered by the Acts of Congress, as belonging to the Quota of this State. We think that Lieut. Winchester of Col<sup>o</sup> Gist's, one of the 16 additional Regiments, comes under this description, and ought to receive his Depreciation.
