We have received several Letters from the lower Counties on the p. 410 Eastern Shore of this State, giving Information of the Enemy landing from their Barges and committing great Depredations. We are called on to give Protection in that Quarter of the State, and it was a serious and capital Object with the General Assembly, that such Protection should be given. It is in vain to go on with a new Equipment of the Barges, before the Arrearages of the former are discharged, because it cannot be done, but upon the Credit of the Monies to arise from the Taxes of the present Year, and to acquire that Credit, former Engagements must be first satisfied.
