Sterling p Cent. and he is to have Credit for all the Advances made to the Officers of the Maryland Line, upon his making out an Account against each Officer, and proving it according to Law. The Money received from M^r Simmonds, may be applied to the Payment of the five Months Pay, directed by the General Assembly, but the Sum received must be replaced, and lodged in the Treasury, subject to our Order, out of the first Funds appropriated to that Purpose. Enclosed you have an Order on M^r Simmonds to pay to your Order, the Balance in his Hands.
