The Subject mentioned in yours of the 7th we conceive lies within the Department of the Commissioners for the Sale and Preservation British Property, over which you only have the controling Power. Not being an Affair which can properly come before us, and there being a Difference of Opinion between you and the Commissioners as to the Practicability and Policy of the Sale, we do not choose to interfere in the Matter, especially as we have not a competent Knowlege of the Subject.

Yours by the Post of the first Instant, was just now handed us. It gives us great Concern to hear that the Enemy's Barges continue their Depredations. There can be no Doubt but what all Expences on Account of the Militia will be paid by the State: nothing can be more reasonable, and our Endeavours to have them paid, shall be faithfully exerted. We have now some Money in the Treasury, and we have began to enlist Men for the Barges, but cannot say when we shall be able to equip them fit for Service. Altho' the French Commodore was so obliging as to promise us an armed Vessel, yet, she is not yet come; possibly, as he informed us Repairs were wanting, that Circumstance may still detain her. The Post is not yet come in and therefore can say nothing of Intelligence from the Northward: we are still left in Suspence, as to Peace or War.

March 8
