Whereas it appears to this Board that John Stouder of Frederick County was fined thirty pounds specie by a Militia Court Martial held at Frederick Town 21 September 1781 for not doing duty as Guard to the British Convention Troops at Frederick Town and it is represented by the Petition of the said John Stouder certified by several of his Neighbours and also the Deposition of John Carter and Thomas Brown that he the said John Stouder was sick when he should be on Duty and continued so the best part of the Summer— It is therefore ordered that Twenty nine pounds, part of the thirty pounds aforesaid be and is hereby remitted.—
