Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Capt Rob^t Denny thirty seven pounds, ten shillings Specie to be expended in Defraying the Expences of General Smallwoods Table agreeable to a Resolution of the General Assembly on Account

That the said Treasurer pay to Doct^r James Brown of the Hospital Department thirteen pounds, ten shillings specie part of the money appropriated for the Officers at the Southward &^{ca} on Account

Whereas John Stump of Harford County did on the 28th Day of January 1781 enter into Bond with sufficient Security to the Governor and Council for the Time being in the penal sum of two thousand pounds, Conditioned that he would not depart the District of Harford County without leave being first obtained from the Governor and Council and that he would be of good behaviour during his continuance therein. Be it known that Circumstances having changed the said John Stump and his Security shall be discharged from the said Bond upon his giving Bond for the same Sum with sufficient Security that he will not depart this State and be of good Behaviour during the present War. On M^r Richard Dallam's certifying that the last mentioned Bond is duly executed then this shall be deemed a full Discharge from the Bond of the 28th of January 1781.—
