M<sup>r</sup> John Campbell has represented to Us, that he resided several Years at Bladensburgh as an Agent for a Commercial House in Glassgow, previous to the Year 1776, and that in the Spring of that Year, having no farther connexion with America, he returned to Great Britain, his native Country, when, and in New York, he has since been engaged in the Mercantile line-And that since the Peace, viewing himself in the light of a real British Subject, he has returned to Bladensburgh, for the purpose of carrying on his Business as a Merchant. We are clearly of opinion, that Mr Campbell is a British Subject, and as such he has an undoubted Right under our Laws and the Treaty to reside in this State and while he is a Resident and conducts himself with Propriety he is entitled to the Protection of this Government, and all Acts and Proceedings molesting him in the Enjoyment of his Property and personal Security ought to be discouraged by every Citizen, and prevented by the Authority of the Magistrates. We request you will communicate these our Sentiments to the Gentlemen of your Bench.
