Capt Delisle informs Us that he took about 140 hhds Tobacco from Virginia and cleared out from thence, and that he afterwards brought his Ship to Patuxent to compleat her Load, and that you p. 451 now refuse to clear her, unless he pays 5/p hhd upon the Tobacco he brought from Virginia. There is no existing Law imposing a Duty of 5/p hhd upon Virginia Tobacco under these Circumstances—that part of the Act of June 1780 which imposes a Duty upon Tobacco and Pigg Iron, exported from this State was repealed, by an Act entitled An Act to repeal certain Duties, passed April Session 1782 and it is our Opinion, that the Virginia Tobacco not being Landed in this State, is not Subject to the one p Cent imposed on all Goods imported into this State by the Act which passed November Session 1782, entitled An Act for the Defence of the Bay and to impose certain Duties on imported Articles.—
