That the Said Treasurer pay to William Goldsmith seven pounds, nineteen shillings and Six pence of the Same Emission of the Money aforesaid due him per Acc<sup>t</sup> passed by the Depy Aud.—

p. 208 Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Doct<sup>r</sup> Philip Thomas sixty seven pounds, fourteen shillings and nine pence Specie agreeable to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State due him per Account passed by the Aud. That the Said Treasurer pay to His Excellency Governor Lee fifty eight pounds, four shillings and six pence of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit &<sup>ca</sup> of the money app<sup>d</sup> for the present Campaign per Cert<sup>e</sup> settled by the Dep<sup>y</sup> Aud to this Inst.
