A Petition from Matthew Whiting at Sharpsburgh in Washingp. 492 ton County, was presented to the Board, setting forth that in December 1779 he removed from the State of Virginia to this State, where he carried on the Distilling Business, and soon after was informed of an Act of the General Assembly prohibiting the Distilling of Grain into Spirit—in order to avoid the Penalties of the Law, he applied to one of the Justices of the Peace for the said County, who
