We assent to your Proposition of paying the Money in your Hands, to those Persons from whom you received Cloathing as Collector, but you will observe that this Money must be accounted for, in the Settlement of your Account, as Specie, your Vouchers therefore, should be such as will satisfy the Auditor. If Shoes or Hatts can be procured, we wish the Money to be applied to the Purchase of those Articles

In our Letter of the 3^d of Dec^r last, we requested you to order out immediately, for two Months, 50 Militia of your County, as Part of a Guard of 200 Men, to be placed over the Prisoners confined at Frederick Town, and to be relieved at the Expiration of their Tour by the same Number. We are much surprized, upon receiving Information from Maj^r Bailey, who has the Command of the Guard, that not a Man from your County had joined him. We have now to reiterate our former Orders, and to insist upon the strictest Compliance therewith
