That John Dauies is by Bill bownd to pay yo<sup>r</sup> Pet<sup>r</sup> 3000<sup>l</sup> Tob.  
p<sup>r</sup> Anñ, All w<sup>ch</sup> is now due, But (to defraud as I conceiue) yo<sup>r</sup> Pet<sup>r</sup>,  
is informed hee hath now made ouer his Crop, & putts yo<sup>r</sup> Pet<sup>r</sup> of  
w<sup>th</sup> delayes, & refuses to build for yo<sup>r</sup> Pet<sup>r</sup>, allthough by his Bill  
hee is allso thereto bownd to satisfy part, or all th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Debt, if yo<sup>r</sup>  
Pet<sup>r</sup> had desyred itt w<sup>ch</sup> hee did: But by th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Dauies was still  
foold, w<sup>th</sup> promises & false protestaōns & now refuses absolutely to  
build att all, Saying it will spoyle his Crop.

The humble Pet<sup>n</sup> of ffrancis Gonby, Sheweth

That Pet<sup>r</sup> by Indenture Recorded in th<sup>e</sup> Citty of Bristoll in th<sup>e</sup>  
Kingdome of England became bownd unto Richard Deauer of th<sup>e</sup>  
County of Anarundell in th<sup>e</sup> Prouince of Maryland to serue th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup>  
Deauer in this Prouince to th<sup>e</sup> full end & tearme of 4 yeares after  
his first & next arryuall in this Prouince, to worke att Joyners worke  
& noe other, ffor & in Consideraōn of w<sup>ch</sup> th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Deauer was to allow  
unto yo<sup>r</sup> Pet<sup>r</sup> by Couen<sup>t</sup> & condicōn under th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Deauers hand yearely  
& euery yeare during the tearme of his seruice by Indenture due, the  
full third part of what hee should by his Labour gayne & ouer &  
about Two suites of good Cloath, & ffowre shirts Euery yeare.

Now soe it is th<sup>t</sup> during th<sup>e</sup> Voyage from Bristoll to this Prouince,  
th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Deauer yo<sup>r</sup> Pet<sup>r</sup> unto William Jennings th<sup>e</sup> Chyrurgeon of th<sup>e</sup>  
ship in w<sup>ch</sup> hee was transported hath assigned, W<sup>ch</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Jennings yo<sup>r</sup>  
Pet<sup>r</sup> unto George Beckwith of S<sup>t</sup> Josephs manno<sup>r</sup> in Caluert County  
hath reassigned, W<sup>ch</sup> s<sup>d</sup> George beckwith doth deny to performe th<sup>e</sup>  
Condiōns originally made betweene him th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Deauer, uppon w<sup>ch</sup>  
only hee was obliged to serue, But th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Condiōn under th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup>  
Deauers hand to yo<sup>r</sup> Pet<sup>r</sup> made for th<sup>e</sup> allowance of th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Cloathing,  
& share or part of his Labour hath taken away by force or fraude  
during yo<sup>r</sup> Pet<sup>r</sup>'s late sicknes.

Wherefore yo<sup>r</sup> Pet<sup>r</sup> humbly prayes th<sup>t</sup> th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Deauer as well as th<sup>e</sup>  
s<sup>d</sup> Jennings & Beckwith may bee summoned to th<sup>e</sup> next Prouinciall  
Court, there to sett forth uppon Oath what Couenants Condiōns
