This Indenture made th<sup>e</sup> Eleauenth day of ffeb. in th<sup>e</sup> yeare of our Lord God one Thows<sup>d</sup> six hund<sup>d</sup> sixty & Three, Betweene Andrew Woodbery of Salem in New England mariner of th<sup>e</sup> one parte, & Will<sup>m</sup> Tanehill of Poplar Hill in th<sup>e</sup> County of S<sup>t</sup> Maries Plant<sup>r</sup> on th<sup>e</sup> other parte, Wittneseth th<sup>t</sup> th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Andrew Woodbery for & in Consideraōn of ffowre Thows<sup>d</sup> ffowre hund<sup>d</sup> pownds of Tob & Cask to him in hand payd, whereof & wherewith hee doth acknowledge himselfe fully satisfied contented & payd, Hath gyuen, graunted, remised, released, bargayned, sold, assigned, & for euer sett ouer, & by these p<sup>r</sup>nts doth giue, graunt, remise release, bargaine, sell, assigne, & for euer sett ouer unto th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Will<sup>m</sup> Tenehill his heyres or assignes all th<sup>t</sup> Three hund<sup>d</sup> & ffifty Acres of Land, Lying on th<sup>e</sup> Sowth side of Patux<sup>t</sup> Riuer, & th<sup>e</sup> North side of a Creeke of th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Riuer called S<sup>t</sup> Stephens Creeke, Bownding as on th<sup>e</sup> Pattent of th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Land graunted to Richard Crackbone the Three & Twentieth day of Nouemb<sup>r</sup> in the Seauen & Twentieth yeare of his L<sup>ps</sup> Dominion ouer this Prouince Añoq̄ Dñi 1658, To haue & to hold th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Three hund<sup>d</sup> and ffifty Acres of Land to him th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Will<sup>m</sup> Tenehill his heyres & assignes foreuer, W<sup>th</sup> warranty from th<sup>e</sup> Just Claymes of any p<sup>r</sup>son or p<sup>r</sup>sons whatsoeu<sup>r</sup>.
