That Francis Riggs late of Caluert County dec<sup>d</sup> did on the 5<sup>th</sup> of January 1663 Obleige himselve his heires Executo<sup>rs</sup> and Administrat<sup>rs</sup> to pay unto Thomas Bradley his heires or Assignes the su<sup>m</sup>e of fflowre hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco w<sup>th</sup> Caske according to Act of Assembly uppon the tenth day of Nouember 1664 as by the s<sup>d</sup> Riggs his specialty may more at large appeare—

Now soe it is the said debt being lawfully assigned to yo<sup>r</sup> pet<sup>r</sup> he hath often made demand thereof from Richard Collett the Administrato<sup>r</sup> of the said Riggs who utterly refuseth it to satisfye, being to the da<sup>m</sup>age of yo<sup>r</sup> pet<sup>r</sup>, Whereuppon he bringeth his suite
