Christopher Stephenson ſtōds writt ags<sup>t</sup> William Watts In an accōn of Detinue to the uallue of 6000<sup>th</sup> tob:

Warr<sup>t</sup> to sherriffe S<sup>t</sup> Marys County to arrest &<sup>c</sup>. Reē 13<sup>th</sup> June next Prouin<sup>all</sup> Court

To the hon<sup>ble</sup> the Gouverno<sup>r</sup> and Councill of the Prouince of Maryland  
 The humble pet<sup>n</sup> of Christopher Stephenson Sheweth

That whereas it was agreed uppon betweene Will<sup>m</sup> Watts and Christopher Stephenson that the said Stephenson should with the said Watts make a Crop of Corne and tobacco this p<sup>r</sup>sent yeare and the said Stephenson was to pay to the said William Watts for his dyett &<sup>c</sup> 300<sup>th</sup> tob: or one steere of three yeares old, whereuppon the said Stephenson brought all his Clothes and Goods to the house of the said W<sup>m</sup> Watts, and likewise one mare which the said Stephenson had bought the last yeare of Hugh and William Woodbury & payd the one halfe of his said debt for the mare then ready downe and past his bill for the remaind<sup>r</sup> of the other halfe to be paid this Crop w<sup>th</sup> which the said Woodbury was Content.

But now soe it is, that uppon some fallings out betwixt the aboue-said partyes the said Stephenson not intending to liue any longer w<sup>th</sup> the said Watts in regard of his dayly abusing the said Stephenson
