Agatha Langworth aged 50 yeares or thereabouts sworne on th<sup>e</sup> 27<sup>th</sup> day of Septemb<sup>r</sup> 1665 sayth,

This Depon<sup>t</sup> Lay sick on her Table on th<sup>e</sup> 17<sup>th</sup> day of August last, & better by an hower & a halfe of sunne when came fflower Indians & knock'd att th<sup>e</sup> doare. The wench by name Lewis Good told this [p. 70] Depon<sup>t</sup> That shee thought it had bene th<sup>e</sup> Children But Cryed Indians & flung open th<sup>e</sup> doore, w<sup>th</sup> th<sup>t</sup> this Depon<sup>t</sup> turnd about, & made to th<sup>e</sup> doore & fownd one of th<sup>e</sup> 4 Indians by name Chotyke w<sup>th</sup> in th<sup>e</sup> roome & th<sup>e</sup> Dogge keeping a barking att him, hee made some blowes att itt, still Looking upon this Depon<sup>t</sup>, & made a back blowe att her w<sup>th</sup> a Tomahauke, but mist her whereuppon hee retreated out of th<sup>e</sup> roome, Thinking (as this Depon<sup>t</sup> supposeth) th<sup>t</sup> shee might shutt him in th<sup>e</sup> roome. Then this Depon<sup>t</sup> clapt to th<sup>e</sup> doore, when shee did then see th<sup>e</sup> other Indian by name Bennett, & now in custody w<sup>th</sup> Chotyke next to this Chotyke, & another called th<sup>e</sup> old ffisherman alias Inuoyce, th<sup>t</sup> escaped after taken in custody: & likewise another Indian, w<sup>ch</sup> was not knowne by this Depon<sup>t</sup> was then likewise att this Depon<sup>ts</sup> howse att this p<sup>nt</sup> time. Then they went rownd about th<sup>e</sup> howse two or three times, after this Depon<sup>t</sup> had shutt herselfe in th<sup>e</sup> howse. Then shee went to a window next to a neighbo<sup>rs</sup> of hers & hollowed & Cryed Indians, Indians. W<sup>th</sup> th<sup>t</sup> th<sup>e</sup> neighbo<sup>rs</sup> came, In w<sup>ch</sup> interim this Depon<sup>t</sup> heard her Children cry out saying, Good nindians, good nindians, After w<sup>ch</sup> this Depon<sup>t</sup> did againe see th<sup>e</sup> fores<sup>d</sup> fflower Indians, & after that fownd Two of her children murthered. And further this Depon<sup>t</sup> sayth not.

Agatha Langworth/

Lewis Good aged 21 yeares or thereabouts sworne on th<sup>e</sup> 27<sup>th</sup> day of Septemb<sup>r</sup> 1665, sayth

This Depon<sup>t</sup> being in th<sup>e</sup> howse of her mistresse Agatha Langworth on th<sup>e</sup> 17<sup>th</sup> day of August last, att w<sup>ch</sup> time her s<sup>d</sup> mistresse was ill & Lay upon th<sup>e</sup> Table, when there came to th<sup>e</sup> doores fflower Indians who knockd att th<sup>e</sup> doore when this Depon<sup>t</sup> thought it had bene th<sup>e</sup> Children, & opened th<sup>e</sup> doore, & then cryed Indians, Whereuppon her mistresse came of from th<sup>e</sup> table (this Depon<sup>t</sup> not shutting th<sup>e</sup> doore againe) & went to the doore, when one of th<sup>e</sup> Indians, when one of th<sup>e</sup> Indians by name Chotyke, now in custody was stryking att th<sup>e</sup> dogge th<sup>t</sup> was barking att them, & struck one back blowe att this depon<sup>ts</sup> mistresse, when hee did not misse of hitting her but by a small matter, whereuppon hee retreated backwards, & her mistresse shoote th<sup>e</sup> doores upon them, And then they lay striking upon th<sup>e</sup> doore w<sup>th</sup> their Tomahauks.
