[p. 79] Anthony Brispo aged 20 yeares or thereabouts sworne & examined in open Court this 11 of Octob<sup>r</sup> 1665 sayth

That hee see Jacob th<sup>e</sup> negro stab M<sup>rs</sup> Mary Vtye uppon Saturday th<sup>e</sup> 30<sup>th</sup> of Septemb<sup>r</sup> last, about Ten of th<sup>e</sup> Clock in th<sup>e</sup> night, That hee stabbed her w<sup>th</sup> a knife here produced in Court, That in outward appearance shee was in p<sup>f</sup>ect health before hee wounded her, That hee th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Jacob gaue her Two wounds in th<sup>e</sup> Right arme, One whereof was ffowre fingers wide, & th<sup>t</sup> shee dyed uppon the Wednesday att night following, And further th<sup>t</sup> hee doth beleive th<sup>t</sup> shee dyed of those wounds hauing bled a day & a night.

Francis Stockett aged 31 yeares or thereabouts sworne & examined this 11<sup>th</sup> of Octob<sup>r</sup> 1665 sayth

That hee dressed th<sup>e</sup> wounds gyuen by Jacob th<sup>e</sup> negro to M<sup>rs</sup> Mary Vtye Viz<sup>t</sup>, Two wounds in her arme, whereof one was fowre fingers wide, And th<sup>t</sup> hee doth uerily beleive shee dyed of those wounds
