Memorandum that William Caluert Esq<sup>o</sup> Attorney Generall for  
 the Rig<sup>t</sup> Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord Prop<sup>r</sup> who as well for the said Lord Pro-  
 prietary as for the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Charles Caluert Esq<sup>o</sup> Leiu<sup>nt</sup> Generall &  
 cheife Gouverno<sup>r</sup> of this Prouince as for himselfe followeth. Comes  
 into Court of the said Lord Prop<sup>r</sup> before the Gouverno<sup>r</sup> & Councell  
 the fifth day of January one thowsand six hundred sixty ffue in his  
 proper person and as well for the Lord Prop<sup>r</sup> as for the said Charles  
 Caluert Esq<sup>o</sup> Gouverno<sup>r</sup> of Maryland as alsoe for himselfe giues the  
 Court afores<sup>d</sup> here to understand, That whereas a Certaine Act of  
 Parliament of King Charles the second that now is begunn att West-  
 minster the eighth of May one thowsand six hundred sixty one in  
 the thireteenth yeare of his Raig<sup>n</sup>e and their Continued till the nine-  
 teenth of May in the foureteenth yeare of his Ma<sup>ties</sup> Raig<sup>n</sup>e and  
 thence Prorogued to the Eighteenth of ffebruary then next follow-  
 ing and there Continued till the seauen and twentyth of July in the  
 fifteenth yeare of his Ma<sup>ties</sup> Raig<sup>n</sup>e and then Prorogued to the six-  
 teenth of March then next following It stands Enacted by the Au-  
 [p. 177] thority of the said Parliament, That from and after The fvue &  
 twentyth day of March One thowsand six hundred sixty ffoure Noe  
 Comodity of th<sup>e</sup> Growth produc<sup>o</sup>n or manufacture of Europe shall  
 bee imported into any land Island planta<sup>o</sup>n Colony Territory or  
 place to his mat<sup>y</sup> belonging or which shall belong hereafter unto or  
 be in the possession of his majesty his heires & successors in Asia  
 Africa or America (Tangier only excepted) but what shall be bona  
 fide & w<sup>th</sup>out fraud laden & shipped in England Wales or the towne  
 of Berwick uppon Tweede & in English built shippinge or which were  
 bona fide bought before the first day of October One thowsand six  
 hundred sixty & two and had such Certificcate thereof as is directed  
 in one Act passed the last sessions of this p<sup>r</sup>sent Parliam<sup>t</sup> Entitled  
 an Act for preuenting Frauds & regulating abuses in his Mat<sup>ies</sup> Cus-  
 tomes, & whereof the mast<sup>r</sup> & three fourths of the marriners att least  
 are English and which shall be carryed directly thence to the said  
 lands Islands planta<sup>o</sup>ns Colonies Territoryes or places & from no  
 other place or places w<sup>t</sup>soeuer any law statute or Vsage to the Con-
