No. 13 An Act for the Relief of such Persons as cannot find Surety for their Appearance to testify as a Witness against any Person arrested, accused, or prosecuted, for any Criminal Matter.

Whereas many indigent Persons, or Strangers, have been necessarily, for Want of Suretles to appear as Witnesses, committed to [Preamble.] Prison, by Means whereof such Persons have been often sold as Servants for the Prison Fees arising upon such Commitment, or otherwise detained in Prison for such Fees, to their great Damage and Loss to the Public in the Labour of such Person or Persons:
