 ciates Justices of this Court and upon hearing and Debating there-  
 upon, and upon Reading the Comp<sup>lts</sup> bill and the Defend<sup>ts</sup> answere  
 thereunto, with the Depositions and proofes taken in, this Cause  
 being all by this Court Seriously viewed and Considered, and hear-  
 ing of what could be alleged on Either side, This Court was all  
 Clearly satisfied That the Depositions taken in this Cause for the  
 Complainant be entred upon Record, and so preserved for the future,  
 that they may be good Evidence for the Comp<sup>lt</sup> touching the Land  
 in the bill and answere mentioned, in case the witnesses Should dy  
 before the same Come in Dispute and that the bill be dismissed out  
 of this Court as to any Judgem<sup>t</sup> to be had thereupon, and that the

 Records of this Court, and that the bill be Dismissed out of this  
 Court as to any Judgem<sup>t</sup> of this Court to be had touching the same.  
 And this Court doe further order adjudge ordaine and Decree that  
 the Comp<sup>lt</sup> John Halfhead pay to the Defend<sup>t</sup> Joseph Edloe the sume  
 of Two Thowsand pounds of Tobacco for his Costs accordingly.
