

Liber P C might be Legally discharged of their trust and be for ever hereafter  
 pected Indemnified & Saved harmlesse by y<sup>e</sup> Decree of this Court  
 against their bond without which decree they humbly conceived it  
 would not be Safe for them to Doe The Same not being to come to  
 the Said Ann till her Age of eightene Years and in case of her  
 death before that time the s<sup>d</sup> estate being by Will otherwise Littited  
 & appointed or if this court should not think fitt to take the Said  
 Estate out of their hands till her arrivall to the Said Age of Eightene  
 Years shee being now but Sixteene years old they were & should be  
 willing out of the Said Estate to allow the Comp.<sup>lts</sup> Such Reasonable  
 allowance for the mayntenance of the Said Ann Since her Marriage  
 and till shee Come to eightene Years of Age as this Court shall  
 p. 71 allow of they being indemnified as aforesd as by the Said bill answer  
 & other p<sup>r</sup>ceedings uppon the Same Remaining of Record in the  
 Secretaries office Rela<sup>o</sup>n being thereunto had may more plainly  
 appeare And the Said cause So standing att yssue uppon bill &  
 answer A Day was by this Court Appointed for hearing thereof on  
 which Day being the eleaventh Day of december in the year of our  
 Lord 1674 This cause coming to a hearing in the p<sup>r</sup>sence of the Said  
 p<sup>r</sup>ts Richard & all the def<sup>ts</sup> & other Attorneys in this cause uppon  
 Reading of the Said bill and answer and the will of the Said Coff  
 John Price this court was ffully Satisfied with the Ability of the  
 Said comp.<sup>lts</sup> to manage their owne Estate themselves and that it was  
 Just and Reasonable that they should have poss<sup>o</sup>n thereof to Im-  
 prove the Same for the best for their future livelyhood doe thinke fitt  
 & itt is this p<sup>r</sup>sent Day that is to Say on the Eleaventh Day of  
 December in the 43<sup>th</sup> Yeare of the Dominion of Cæcilius Absolute  
 Lord & Prop<sup>r</sup>y of the Provinces of Maryland & Avalon Lord Baron  
 of Baltmore &<sup>c</sup> Anno<sup>o</sup> dom<sup>i</sup> 1674 By the Right Hono.<sup>ble</sup> Charles  
 Calvert Esq<sup>o</sup> Cheife Justice in Equity the Hono.<sup>ble</sup> the Chancello<sup>r</sup> and  
 the Rest of their Associates Justices of this Court Ordered Ad-  
 iudged & Decreed that the Said Severall def.<sup>ts</sup> doth forthwith pay  
 or cause to be paid to the Said comp.<sup>lts</sup> Richard & Ann Hatton the  
 Said Sume of twenty thowsand ffive hundred & ffifty pounds of  
 tobacco in the Said acc.<sup>t</sup> menconed as also that they doe forthwith  
 deliv<sup>r</sup> unto the Said comp.<sup>lts</sup> or their order the like quantity & Stock  
 of Cattle horses hoggs & goods in the Said acc.<sup>t</sup> men<sup>o</sup>ned according  
 to Age & number or full Satisfac<sup>o</sup>n for the Same according to the  
 true intent & meaning of the condic<sup>o</sup>n of y<sup>e</sup> Said bond of Eighty  
 thowsand pounds of tobacco entred into as aforesaid and that the  
 Receipt or other Legall discharge or Release under the hands and  
 Seales of the Said Comp.<sup>lts</sup> shall be their Sufficient discharge for  
 the Same tobacco goods & Stock of cattle & hoggs aforesaid and  
 against the Said bond of eighty thowsand pounds of tobacco And  
 it is also further ordered & Decreed that the Said Defd<sup>ts</sup> Doe also  
 forthwith Quitt the possession of the Lands Planta<sup>o</sup>ns & p<sup>r</sup>misses in
