Caecilius Absolute Lord and Proprietary of the p<sup>u</sup>inces of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltemore &c To all p<sup>o</sup>sons to whome these p<sup>o</sup>sents Shall Come Greetinge In our Lord God Everlastinge Knowe yee that wee for and in Consideraōn that M<sup>r</sup> James Lynsey of Charles County in the Province of Maryland Gent<sup>l</sup> hath dew unto him fowre hundred acres of land w<sup>th</sup>in this p<sup>u</sup>ince as appeareth Uppon Record in our Said p<sup>u</sup>ince of Maryland and Uppon Such Condiōns and tearmes as are expressed in our Condiōns of Plantaōn of our p<sup>u</sup>ince of Maryland under our greater Seale att armes beareing date at London the 2<sup>d</sup> Day of July In the yeare of our Lord God one Thowsand Six hundred Forty & Nyne and remayneing Uppon Record in our Sayd p<sup>u</sup>ince of Maryland w<sup>th</sup> Such alteraōn as In them is made by our decleraōn beareing date the 26<sup>th</sup> day of Aug<sup>t</sup> A<sup>n</sup>o 1651, likewise remayneing Upon Record in our Said Province of Maryland doe hereby Graunt unto him the Said
