Thomas Hinson sworne saith

That yor Dept being at Mr Wickes his house somtime with in This 2 yeare: where the sd Mr Wickes Did Desier yor Dept to bare witnes That he Did There Tender A heffer Calfe for The Vsse of Mr Hill which was for his boys scholling And wisht yor Dept And his wiffe to Acquaynt mr Hill with The Deliuery And That he would not stand no longer to The hasard of her And That he had no other of her Age & grouth: which yor Dept Did And Mr Hill was very well sattesfied with The Deliuery: And sd That very sudenly after he would send his sunn vp to se her And not long after the sd Mr Hill Did Tell yor Deponant That his sunn had seen The heffer: And That Mr Wickes had Dealt Very honestly with him for he had Caused his men to shew him it: And had vssd his sunn very kindly at his house: which he sd he was very Much behoulding vnto him for: But not long After This And Vnto The time neare his Death The sd Mr Hill severall Times And in Diuers peopells hearing That Mr Wickes [fol. 25] had Don very Dishonesly with him About his Acounts And Reconings with him: And yor Dept And his wiffe Mr Ringgold & sunn & Mr Hills wiffe & sunns hath Demanded how or wherein: And The sd Mr Hill would fetch Deap sieths: And say That he was A very wecked man And had Dealt Very Dishonestly both by him & his sunn Thomas And he was one That nether Regarded god nor his Credit And it will Com whom by him quoth he before he Dies I am prswaded: And Then would often Times shake his head And Desier The peopell not to name his name for he sd his Dishonest Dealings with him Did much Truble him And This he often sd neare to his Diing Day: And That Time would make it Appeare Vnto The world he sd: Tho: Hinson

Whereas it hath ben The great Complaint of Many prons upon This Island Agaynst John Deare for his Comon frequenting The wield gange killing Cattell both ould And young And Marking of Calfes all which he prtends to be his owne: yet is heald very susspitious both by The Complaynants And the Court:
