 for o^r safe returne drawed a botle of the afors^d drams to drincke with
 this dep^{nt}, & Cap^t Vaughan, & at the same tyme the saide Bradnox
 went unto his bedside where the wife of the s^d Bradnox being the s^d
 beed, the s^d Bradnox desired & requested his s^d wife to drinke with
 him: or pledge him a dram & to forgett & pass by all malice or Cause
 of Discord that was betwixt them but the s^d M^{rs} Bradnox would not
 willingly doe but with much pswasion she recd the bottle once or
 twice into her hand & put it to her mouth but wheather or noe she did
 drinke any the s^d drams I cannot depose; & further whilst they were
 adrincking the s^d drams there being three or four men of M^r Bradnox
 family or neighbours drincking pt of the drams, by w^{ch} tyme the
 drincking of the s^d q^{rt} bottle of drams & pt of one more the s^d Brad-
 nox was much disguised with drinke that he was not able to goe nor
 stand & riseing up out of a chair where he satt he fell downe on the
 ground by w^{ch} fall his nose did bleed much, w^{ch} this dep^{nt} & the s^d
 Bradnox wife tooke him up & laid him on the bed & held him & dried
 the bloud from him untill it left bleeding & further saith not

Cap^t Robt Vaughan sworne saith the very same words verba^t &
 further that the s^d Bradnox was uery full of greife through the con-
 tention of his wife & further saith not; but onely that the s^d bradnox
 informed these words to this dep^{nt} at his first coming into the house:

Whereas the Constable for this Iland exhibited a p^rsentment to the
 Courte houlden the 2^o: of febr^y 56 agst M^r Wickes in the case of
 bastardy, & the Euidences to proue the psentment not being p^rsent
 when the matter was in hearings the court saw cause to refer the mat-
 ter to the next court, & the s^d wickes was suspended from his place for
 that p^rsm^t This court takeing Cognisance of the s^d p^rsentment &
 not finding by the Euidences sufficient prooffe to make the s^d wickes
 guilty in the matter of fact: the court doth therefore reuerse the
 first order in point of suspention, & leaue the s^d Wickes in Statuo quo
 prius to his place & Judicature;
