

Liber B The Deposition of m^r Tho: Bradnox Aged 58 yeres or thereabouts taken in Court sworne Examined saith

That some time in July 1654 John Salter desired yo^r Depon^t & Roger Baxter to witsesse to an Agreem^t for A planta^{co}n th^t John Salter Bought of m^r Fr. Brookes of Mariland, w^{ch} Plant^{co}n is Comonly Called by th^e name of Beuer necke, upon th^e Isle of Kent & their bargaine and agreem^t was as Followeth. That th^e afores^d Brookes was to giue & deliuer unto th^e aforesd John Salter peacable and quiet possession of th^e afores^d planta^{co}n, & to giue him a good sufficient Considera^{co}n for th^e sd Land, and that he would likewise defend & saue harmelesse the Fore sd Salter his heires or Assignes For euer, From all psons what soeuer that should by any Title or clame molest disturbe or disquiet th^e sd Salter his Exc^{rs} or Assignes in his peacable or quiet possess^{co}n & enioym^t of the afore s^d planta^{co}n; In considera^{co}n of th^e afore sd agreem^t of th^e afores^d planta^{co}n, well & truly to be pformed by th^e sd Brookes, th^e sd John his Exc^{rs} or Assignes was to pay unto th^e sd Brookes his Exc^{rs} or Assignes 3000^{lb} of good Condi^{co}nd To^b. & Caske, w^{ch} some of To^b was to be payd 1500^{lb} of To^b. after th^e sd Salter had posest th^e planta^{co}n in manner & forme as aforesd one yeare, w^{ch} was to be in the yeare 55, & th^e other 1500^{lb} of To^b in th^e yeare 1656. this was the Full agreem^t betwixt them, & Further saith not
