Margret Brent Complaines against Abraham Holeman in an Accⁿ of th^e Case to th^e vallue of Fiue thousand pounds of Toḃ. & for this bringeth her suite

war^t Issued, returne from th^e Shiriff 20th of th^e same Mo.

Whereas the Court not findeinge, any Cause whereby th^e Defendent should be Arrested & Impleaded, th^e Court doth therefore Order th^t th^e suite be dismist, & A nonsuite granted to th^e def^t, wth Cost of suite, Else Excⁿ.

Whereas Thomas Ringgold th^e Atturny of wiff Boreman not makinge any thinge Appeare to this Court, for occation of A suite, by testimony, or any other writeinge, whereby that John Deere was Ingaged to make deliury of A Stocke of Cattle w^{ch} m^r Ringold Bought of W^m Boreman as m^r Ringgold doth express in his petcon.

The Court doth therefore order that th^e plantiue shall be non suited, granted, wth Cost of suite to th^e Defend^t Else Execucon

To th^e hobl Gour^r Councell: wth th^e Rest of th^e Com^{rs} on th^e Isle of Kent.

The humble peticon of Tho: Ringgold the Atturny of w^m Boreman, Sheweth

That whereas yo^r Pet^r haueinge bought certaine Cattle From m^r Boreman w^{ch} Cattle ware left in th^e Custodye of John Deere, who hath taken upp & had th^e profit of th^e s^d Cattle, & yo^r pet^r cannot gett possession, although he hath diuers times Demanded th^e same, yo^r Pet^r Craues of this hon^{ble} Court to Cause & Compell th^e said John Deere to make a Full deliury of all such Cattle, & yo^r pet^r shall euer pray &c.

Abraham Holeman, Sworne in Court 20th July 1658 saith

That John Deere tould yo^r Depon^t he had one Cow of william Boremans, & one younge Cowe or haifer belonginge to th^e sd Boreman, th^e former Cowe Called by th^e name of Cross w^{ch} th^e s^d Deere shewed yo^r Depon^t & Further saith not.
